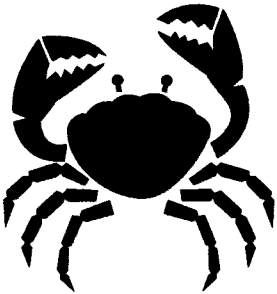
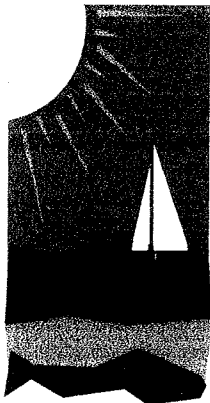

Fishing and Crabbing Fees:

The new fishing and crabbing fees established last year are in effect. Don't get caught without a license.

The following are the Delaware fishing, crabbing and clamming license fees (effective January 1, 2008)

All licenses are good for the calendar year.

General fishing license (fresh and saltwater) \$8.50 (age 16 & older). Nonresident fishing license (same ages) \$20

Have a boat? Recreational boat (less than 20 feet long)

license fee is \$40 for residents & non residents. Recreational boat (larger than 20 feet) \$50. **This fee no longer covers all people fishing or crabbing from the boat. Everyone must have their own license.**

Jean Derickson's birthday is June 11 and Jim & Jean's anniversary is June 6. It would be nice if they received a bunch of cards from their Port Friends.

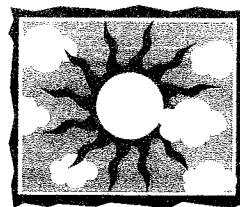
Larry and Nancy Yingling just got a new trailer on their new site (57). Drop by and say hello and maybe they will show you their beautiful new trailer.

MAY'S RECIPE: CRISPY S'MORE TREATS

Ingredients:

- 2 & 1/2 c. Cocoa Crispies
- 6 whole (5 x 2") graham crackers, coarsely chopped
- 3 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 3 & 1/2 c. mini marshmallows, divided
- 3/4 c. milk chocolate morsels

Directions for Making:

Place cereal in a large mixing bowl. Add the chopped graham crackers. Set Aside.

In a 4 qt. saucepan melt the butter with the brown sugar over low heat, stirring occasionally. Add 2 and 1/2 c. marshmallows and stir until melted. Remove from heat and add the cereal mixture. Stir until well coated. Add the remaining marshmallows.

Spray the inside of a clean, empty vegetable can with Pam with Butter. Scoop the cereal mixture into the can until full. Let the cereal mixture cool inside the can. Open the bottom of the pan and push the cereal mixture out onto a cutting board. Cut into 1/2 inch slices.

Melt the chocolate morsels in the microwave on HIGH, for one minute, stirring every 15 seconds, until chocolate is melted. Pour the melted chocolate into a re-sealable sandwich bag. Seal, cut a corner off the bottom and squeeze the chocolate out to decorate the top of each s'more slice. Enjoy!

Residents Meeting Minutes:

April 25, 2009

Call to order: The meeting was called to order by President Richard Powell in Memorial Hall on April 25, 2009 at 9:07 am. Board members present were R. Powell, D. Brady, W. Campbell, G Carter, J. Hurd, S. Loden, R. McDonald, C. Pierce & C. Seaman. There were 121 residents in attendance. Purpose: The purpose of the meeting was to provide information to the residents on happenings in the Port and to get feedback from the residents on Port Operation.

Discussion:

R. Powell discussed the following items:

The *Rules and Regulations* must be reviewed and adhered to.

Electric bills will be sent out twice a season. If the bill is not paid by the due date, service will be shut off (make sure your refrigerator is empty if your bill is not paid) and it will cost \$50 to get it turned on again after the bill has been paid. If the bill at the end of the season is not paid before the due date, your lease will not be renewed and you are expected to move your trailer out of the Port by year end. You can expect your electric bill to increase.

Residents Meeting Minutes: April 25, 2009 (cont'd)

A notice is posted on the Office door concerning propane sales. On meeting day, propane will not be sold or bottles filled.

The shed project is complete for this year with the exception of one shed to be built when the lessee returns from Florida.

More kayak racks will be built.

You need to get ID stickers for your boat if stored at the Port. If you need a registration for your boat or trailer, make sure it is current. If not, it will be considered dead storage and must be removed.

A defibrillator for the Port has been purchased and some Port residents have been trained in its use and CPR.

You are reminded to keep the Rolodex up to date with address and phone number changes. Include a note in the Office mailbox so that Port records can be kept current.

Please break up Cardboard boxes before putting them in the dumpster. Break up larger items as well.

The program "Cleaning Up Sussex County" requires storage lots to be clean, orderly and not used for dead storage. The directors will monitor the use of the Ports storage facilities for compliance.

R. Powell opened the floor for questions and comments from residents:

A resident asked how electric bills are sent. Mr. Powell said by U.S. mail.

Mr. Carey asked how grass clippings are to be disposed of. Mr. Powell said they can be dumped in back of the dumpster.

Recyclables can be deposited in the receptacles behind Walmart

There was a question about limiting the number of slides on trailers and why the rule was made. The board responded that for appearance reasons it was necessary to make the rule.

The sign at the entrance to the gazebo area was placed there to protect the trailer on site 28. Vehicle traffic in this area is limited to that necessary for moving small boats toward the ramp.

PDMV stickers are available for \$2 each.

It is a state law that you MUST pick up after your pets.

SLOW DOWN!! The Port speed limit is 10 mph. Visitors must park in designated areas.

Past Port residents Messrs. Strausberg, Hutton, and Bryson passed away over the winter.

D. Pierce, Ray McDonald & D. Brady thanked everyone for cards & calls received when illness invaded their homes.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:42 am. After a short break, Site Selection took place.

Fishing & Crabbing Fees (cont'd)

Surf fishing vehicle owners whether resident or nonresident are exempt from fishing license requirements if they are the operator of a vehicle with a valid Delaware surf fishing vehicle permit as long as the vehicle is located in a designated Delaware State Park surf fishing area. Normal license fees apply to all other occupants of the vehicle if they are fishing.
