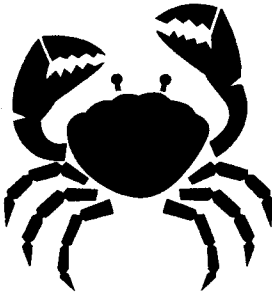

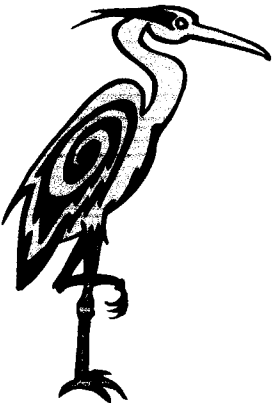

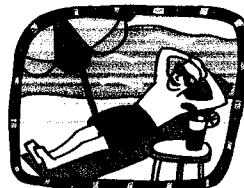
We want to thank everyone who helped us move our trailer from site 80 to site 54. It was quite an endeavor, but with so many helping hands, the move went well.

Minutes from the Residents Meeting:

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by President R. Powell in Memorial Hall on April 30, 2010 at 9:07 am. Board members present were R. Powell, W. Campbell, G. Carter, K. Eidle, C. Pierce, R. Mc Donald, H. Reetz, C. Seaman and B. Storm. There were 102 residents in attendance.

Purpose:

The purpose of the meeting was to provide information to the residents on happenings in the Port and to get feedback from the residents on Port operation.

Discussion:

R. Powell introduced the Port's new residents.

R. Powell discussed the following items:

Electric bills will be issued in late June.

Parking is restricted to one vehicle per site.

Boat trailers are not to be parked on your site except by explicit approval of a director

Dogs are to be on a six foot leash. The

Port is to be provided with proof of insurance and proof of immunizations for the pet.

A large dumpster is on site for use of the residents for the next month.

Recycling dumpsters are available behind Walmart.

Respect your neighbors space.

Contact Site Improvement Committee before digging.

You are responsible for cutting your grass from the time the water is turned on until the water is turned off.

Gas prices will remain the same.

There has been vandalism in the men's bathroom. If it is determined who did it, immediate expulsion from the Port will result.

Keep the Rolodex and the Port office updated with any changes in address and phone numbers.

An AED pads have been replaced.

There has been no action on the CJH (Hudson) request for a 50 ft right of way through Port property.

R. Powell opened the floor for ques-

tions and comments.

Pizza tonight at 5:30 pm.

Steve Loden thanked the Board for their efforts.

The speed limit in the Port is 10 mph. Please observe it.

The passing of Jeanette Coppa and Joanne Karch was noted.

There will be a chicken dinner on May 28.

Adjournment:

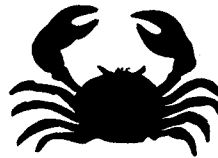
There being no further comments, the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 am.

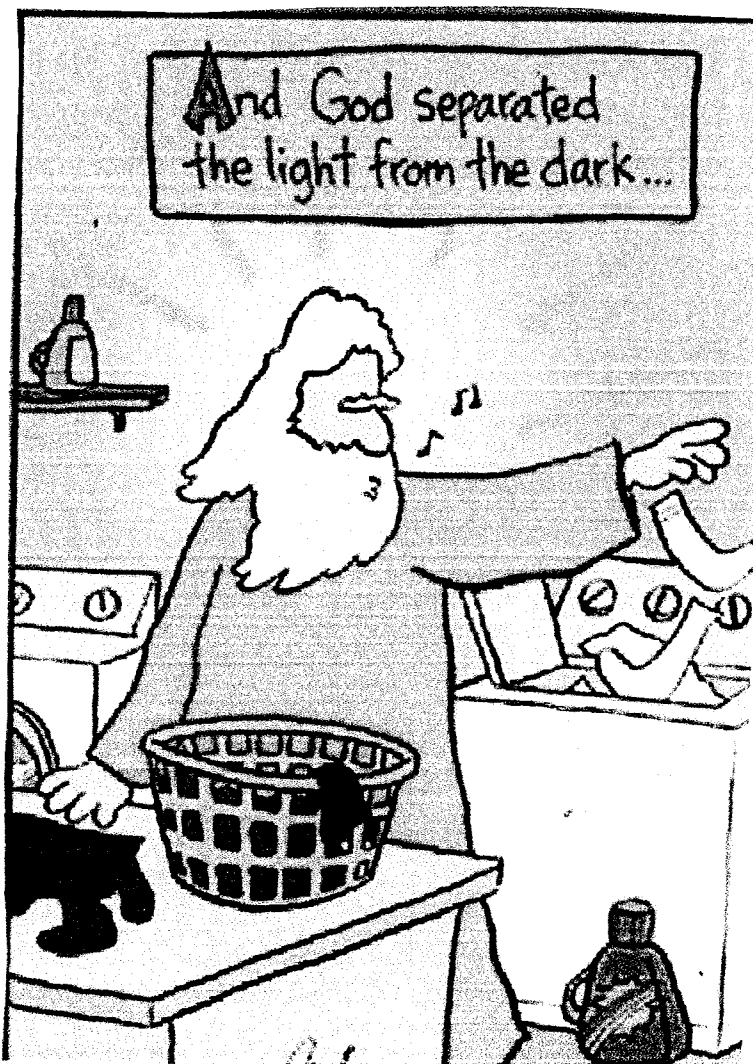
